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
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A.G. Rhodes Health & Rehab announce new CEO

As CEO, Cateau is responsible for an operating budget of approximately \$40 million. Rhodes since 2009, and prior to that, numerous responsibilities with Five Star Quality Care Inc., a national senior living communities and services provider, and his prior management of a 200-unit continuing care retirement community in Savannah.

In addition to being a licensed nursing home administrator, Cateau is certified by the National Council of Certified Dementia Practitioners as a certified dementia practitioner and a certified alzheimer's disease and care dementia trainer. He is also a certified eden alternative educator and a certified virtual dementia tour facilitator for nursing homes. He serves on the Board of Directors for LeadingAge Georgia.

Cateau holds a Bachelor's degree in History and a post graduate diploma in International Relations from the University of the West Indies St. Augustine campus and a certification in Global Leadership Development from the University of the Virgin Islands.



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He has published two articles on long-term care — "Act as Though Your Customer is Right" in Nursing Homes Magazine in May 2005; and "Skilled Nursing Facilities and Hospice Providers: Bridging the Gap" in Nursing Homes Magazine in November 2006.
