She began her health care career as a speech pathologist, having received her master's degree in speech-language pathology from the University of Rhode Island. She holds a number of advanced certifications, including Dementia Capable Care Instructor, MBSImp, Spaced Retrieval and Neuromuscular Electrical Stimulation for Dysphagia. She lives in Medfield, Mass., and in her free time serves as a help-line volunteer for the Alzheimer's Association.
