**Niharika Nath**, Ph.D., associate professor of life sciences, co-authored research on a modified aspirin called hydrogen sulfide-releasing aspirin that was synthesized by her co-authors. Her manuscript, "Hydrogen Sulfide-Releasing Aspirin Inhibits the Growth of Leukemic Jurkat Cells," was published on July 26 in the journal *Leukemia Research*. The study demonstrates how the compound destroyed Acute Lymphocytic Leukemia (ALL) cells in tissue culture at very low doses compared to the parent drug aspirin, and therefore it may have less toxicity than aspirin. At the level of mechanism, this compound is also shown to induce cell death pathway and reduce the expression of certain genes that cause cell proliferation.

He also co-wrote the paper, "An Overview of Foreign Currency Exposure," with NYIT M.B.A. student **Simran Kaur**, published in the July 2013 issue of *Asian Journal of Empirical Research*.

**Niharika Nath**, Ph.D., associate professor of life sciences, co-authored the article, "Flurbiprofen Benzyl Nitrate (NBS-242) Inhibits the Growth of A-431 Human Epidermoid Carcinoma Cells and Targets β-catenin," published in the 2013 issue of the journal, *Drug Design*, *Development*, *and Therapy*. The paper discusses a novel compound that was synthesized and shown to be effective against skin cancer cells by studies in cell culture. The compound was demonstrated to inhibit the beta-catenin signaling pathway, which is implicated in development of non-melanoma skin cancers such as basal cell carcinoma and squamous cell carcinoma.

**Susan Neville**, Ph.D., R.N., associate professor and chair of the Department of Nursing, and **Maureen Cardoza**, Ph.D., R.N., assistant professor of nursing, have received funding for the second year of NYIT's Health Resources and Services Administration grant for Workforce Advancement through Geriatric Education. As part of the grant's program, they worked together to offer core and advanced courses in July to professionals at Nassau Health Care Corporation.
