Helipad named for fallen state trooper

Bates on April 18 to dedicate the helipad at the Virginia State Police administrative headquarters in Chesterfield in Bates' honor.

Bates, along with State Police Aviation Unit Commander Lt. H. Jay Cullen III, were killed in a helicopter accident on Aug. 12, 2017, while monitoring violent clashes between white supremecists and protestors in Charlottesville.

Gov. Ralph Northam and former Gov. Terry McAuliffe, along with Secretary of Public Safety and Homeland Security Brian Moran and the family of Trooper-Pilot Bates, unveiled the new sign that designates the helipad in Bates' memory.

Trooper-Pilot Bates joined Virginia State Police in 2004 and became a trooper-pilot with the Virginia State Police Aviation Unit in July 2017. Bates is survived by his wife, twin 12-year-old son and daughter, parents and siblings. Virginia State Police dedicated its Chesterfield Aviation Base and Headquarters in Lt. Cullen's memory in February 2018.
