The 25 citizens who will make up the 2016 class of Leadership Fort Smith were announced for the first time during a class reception Thursday night at the MovieLounge.

In an effort to put a new twist on this event, the 25 participants were not publicly announced beforehand. These 25 community leaders are set to begin their journey through the Leadership Fort Smith program on Aug. 13 at the orientation session and leadership workshop.

The participants were selected based on leadership or potential leadership









ability and commitment to the community, along with several other factors. An effort is made each year to build a diverse, well-rounded class representative of the Fort Smith region. This year is no exception, as the class represents a wide variety of backgrounds, experiences and professions.

Leadership Fort Smith is a 10-month program that offers participants a backstage pass to the Fort Smith region. The class will focus on the strengths, challenges, needs and overall community issues that our participants can directly address. Sessions will cover diverse topics such as education, health care, history, crime, local government and education. In addition, participants will learn about economic development and will have the opportunity to see, hear and meet the catalysts for growth in our region.

Leadership Fort Smith is a professional development opportunity that benefits the participant, employers and the community.

The goal of Leadership Fort Smith is evident from the tag line on its logo — Learn, Connect and Lead. The program gives participants the opportunity to learn the ins and outs of our community, connect to community leaders and organizations and then use that knowledge to lead. Leadership Fort Smith is more than an accomplishment to put on a resume — it is a call to action.

The program began in 1986, graduating its inaugural class in 1987, under then-Westark Community College, now the University of Arkansas at Fort Smith, which led the program for 28 years. In a collaborative effort between the university and the Fort Smith Regional Chamber of Commerce, the decision was made to transfer ownership of the program to the chamber in June.

The Class of 2016:

He holds a finance degree from Liberty University and a master's degree in business administration from DePaul Kellstadt School of Business in Chicago. Borrows served on the national board of directors of the Financial Executives International organization and as finance committee chairman of the Fort Worth Night Shelter.

Dr. Deborah Braboy is a licensed professional counselor with Fresh Roots Counseling in Fort Smith. She holds degrees from California State University, Fullerton, Regent University in Virginia and Northeastern State University in Tahleguah, Okla. She is an adjunct professor for John Brown University and Liberty University.

Jenna Clemons is the director of finance for the Arkansas Foundation for Medical Care. Clemons is a graduate of Southern Arkansas University with a bachelor's degree in business administration and is very involved with Grand Avenue Baptist Church, where she has served on multiple committees for service to the community.

Samantha Cole is the director of community health and access for Mercy-Fort Smith. She is a Lean Six Sigma Black Belt and received her master's in business administration from John Brown University. Cole is a member of the Fort Smith Trails & Greenways Committee and president of the St. Boniface PTO and serves on the Survivor's Challenge and Single Parent Scholarship Fund boards.
