Highlight the Rescue: Norfolk Sheriff's Office

In this week's "Highlight the Rescue" section we hear from Norfolk Sheriff's Office, Project Lifesaver Coordinator, Paul Balance, who contributed the following report for this portion of the newsletter.

On February 15, 2012 an emergency page was received around 8p.m. from the client's son reporting he had left his 75-year-old father with Alzheimer's in the vehicle while he attended a class at Norfolk State University, a very large inner-city facility. When the class was over the client's son found his father had left the vehicle. Residents on campus stated they saw the man getting in and out of the car numerous times. Before calling, the caregiver searched for one hour before notifying us. Within 18 minutes of the initial page 3 NSO units responded, and a plan of action for the search in the southwest corner of the campus where a faint signal was picked up using our LSI-G2 receiver was reviewed. A perimeter was set up and the signal was getting stronger as we headed to the northern edge of the university grounds. The signal became weaker as we proceeded east so we redirected units further north and west. The signal became stronger as we crossed Virginia Beach Blvd and then another block to Princess Anne Road directing us to our client who was located standing on the corner about a ½ mile from where we initially picked up the first signal. The client was evaluated and returned to his son in good condition.


