Sunny Hill, in conjunction with the Illinois Pioneer Coalition, will host the seminar from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Wednesday, June 4, at the county-owned facility, 421 Doris Ave. Becky Haldorson, Assistant Administrator at Sunny Hill and president of the Illinois Pioneer Coalition, said the seminar offers the first step for caregivers who wish to become Certified Dementia Practitioners.

Tammy Virgili, Certified Alzheimer's Disease and Dementia Care Instructor through the National Council for Certified Dementia Practitioners, will be the presenter. More than 20 dementia-specific topics, including diagnosis and prognosis, hoarding, aggressive behavior, nutrition, staff and family support, and end of life, will be covered.
