Staffing is measured on the ratio of residents to staff. Quality is ranked based on how well the home cares for residents' needs.

They have been named the best nursing home and best assisted living in the Sheboygan Press Best of Sheboygan County Readers' Choice for the past two years running (2012 and 2013 poll).
