Six teens finish program to 'Boost' healthy choices

NORTHBRIDGE — Six young people recently graduated from the first session of the Boost program at Whitin Community Center.

The program is a new pilot program designed to address the needs of at-risk youth ages 12 to 17. The first session was held this spring. Boost incorporates fitness and nutrition through the use of games, music, sports, yoga and other activities. This program also addresses making healthy and informed choices in partnership with Family Continuity Programming of Whitinsville.

The Whitin Community Center received a matching grant of \$20,000 from Fallon Community Health Plan's Community Benefits Program for the program. The center was able to raise the matching \$20,000 through its annual fund drive.

The graduates are: **Alex Mailhiot** of Douglas, **Darien Masterson** of Whitinsville, **Brian Figueroa** of Whitinsville, **Walter Fernandez** of Northbridge, **Joe Boulette** of Whitinsville and **Ezekiel DeLeon** of Northbridge. These graduates finished 10 weeks and 40 hours worth of programming.

They will each be given a free one-year membership to the Whitin Community Center. They will also be invited back to the next session of the BOOST program in the role of group leaders.

"These youth have worked hard to learn the importance of fitness, nutrition, and appropriate behavior in their lives," said **Katie Lloyd-Evanski**, the center's wellness director and Boost instructor, in a prepared statement. "We look forward to watching them grow as role models for their peers."

The next sessions of Boost are June 23 to July 24 and July 28 to Aug. 28. Each session in the summer is five weeks long, and participants will attend Monday through Thursday from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Toddlers plant gourds to help the hungry

GRAFTON — Toddlers love to get dirty, as mothers in the MOMS Club of Millbury-Sutton know all too well.

Three moms took their children's love of dirt and recently turned it into an opportunity to teach them about the importance of volunteer work. They and their four children turned out on a cold and windy day in May to plant vegetables for the Community Harvest Project, a nonprofit volunteer farming organization based at the Brigham Hill Community Farm in North Grafton. As one of the moms who participated in the event, I left the farm with a sense of pride knowing that at only 2, my daughter could serve the community, help families in need and make a difference in the world.
