Tea Cup Gardening: You can go to any church thrift shop and purchase Tea Cups / Saucers for as little as ten cents. You can use these tea cups to plant seeds, seedlings and spring flowers such as pansies. They are pretty to look at and can be used over and over again.

Purchase a George Forman Grill and make all kinds of things. Grilled Cheese Sandwiches to just about any kind of food can be cooked on the grill. Will smell great too!

Take a ride to a residents' old neighborhood. If the neighbors are still there, arrange a short in visit

Egg Relay: Use hard boiled eggs and large spoons and keep passing until the music stops.

Contact a local church and invite them to perform their Easter Performance. Or if possible take the residents to the performance.

Place large coffee table books of flowers, fairs and water gardens on the table.

Plan a spring art show and show all the art work by your residents. Enter their art work in community art shows and county fairs art exhibits.

Provide paint and paper and have the residents paint a portrait of their neighbor or have a model such as the activity assistant.

Set up Themed areas or rooms: For a garden room have the following props and again many of these can be donated from home or visit the local thrift shop or garden centers or discount stores, such as Target or Wall mart. For the garden room, rakes, shovels, wheel barrow, sun hats, garden gloves, plants, dirt, bird bath, bird houses, vegetable plants, silk butterflies, silk birds, out side chairs and out side tables. what they are wearing. But bring enough people to provide one on one supervision at all times.

Take a drive to view the Cherry Blossoms when they are in full bloom. Also many areas have Lilac Festivals.

Get the garden ready, pull weeks and rake. Provide one rake for each person. If raised beds, provide hand small rakes.

Visit local nurseries, garden centers, water garden centers, flower shows.

Plant annuals and or spring bulbs

Make perfume from Lilacs or Roses.

Create a Visual Journey: Put on soft music and ask residents to write down their thoughts of spring or draw spring.

Invite a local farm or petting zoo to bring the baby animals. Be sure to comply with state regulations regarding visiting pets. Many states have pet therapy farms who regularly visit long term care settings.

Have a butterfly farm as it is fun to see the butterflies emerge from the cocoon.

Order a hatchery from a local farm and watch the baby chicks hatch. It is truly amazing and provides hours of enjoyment.
